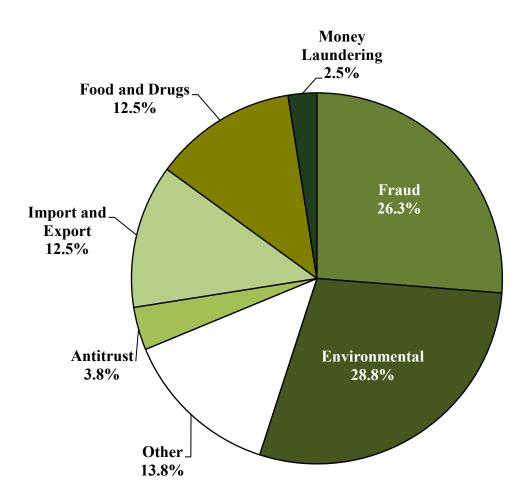

Fiscal Year 2024

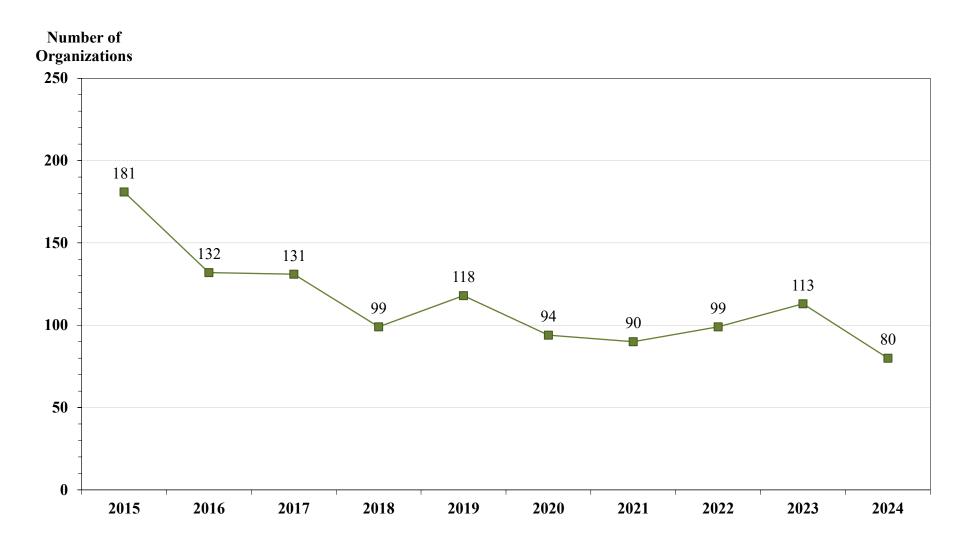

Fiscal Years 2015 - 2024

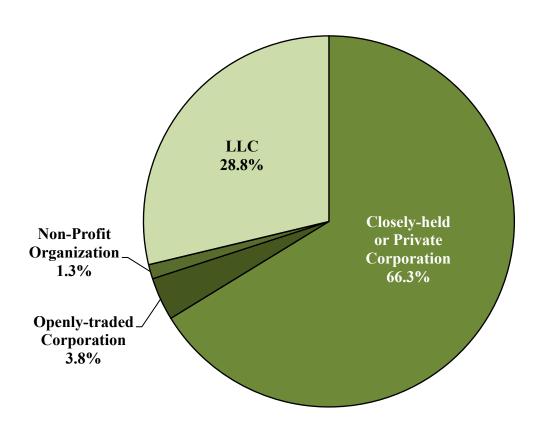

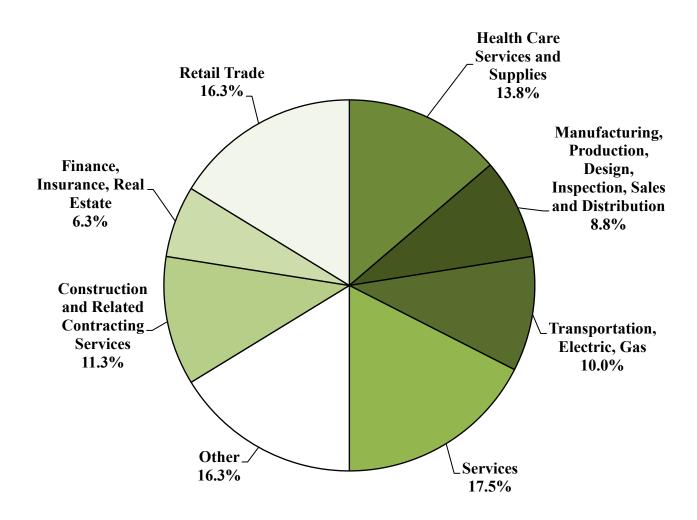
SENTENCED ORGANIZATIONS BY OWNERSHIP STRUCTURE<sup>1</sup>

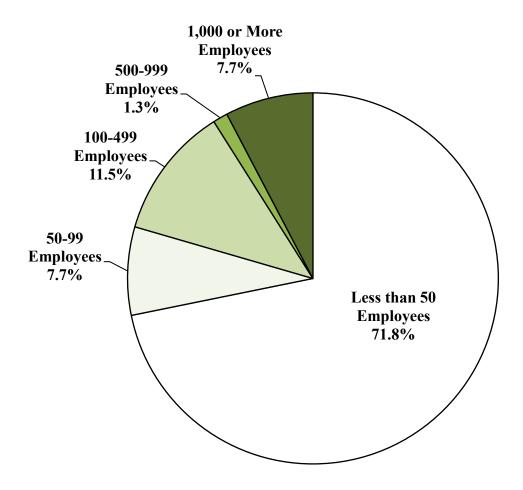
SENTENCED ORGANIZATIONS BY TYPE OF BUSINESS<sup>1</sup>

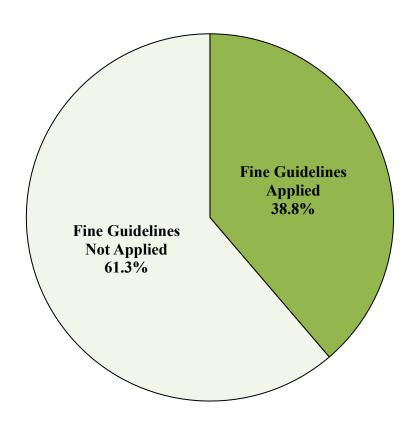

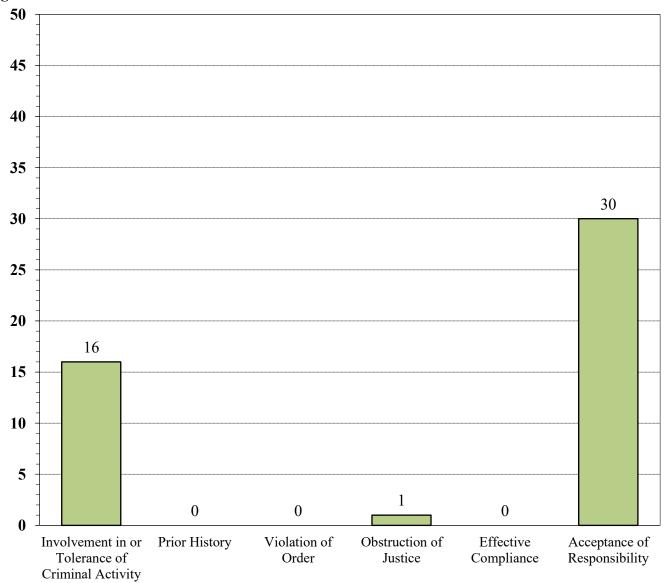
